

TOP · GOMITOLO ALOHA

Design 14 – Filati Gomitolo 05



Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 300 (300, 400) g of Lana Grossa **Gomitolo Aloha** (50% cotton, 50% viscose; 250 m/100 g) in Turquoise/Blue/Emerald/Apple/Yellow-Olive/Sky Blue **(col 304)**. Size 4.5 mm needles; size 4.5 mm circular needle, 40 cm long; one set size 4.5 mm double-pointed needles [dpns].

Rib patt: P2, k2.


Body patt: Multiple of 6 + 5 + 2 selvage sts. Row 1 (RS): Selvage st, k1tbl across, end selvage st. Row 2 (WS): Purl all sts. Rep rows 1 and 2 for body patt.

Gauge: 16 sts and 27 rows = 10 x 10 cm in body patt on size 4.5 mm needles, after sts have been unraveled (see bind off).

Back: Worked side to side. Arrow on schematic shows direction of work. With size 4.5 mm needles cast on 73 sts. Work in body patt until piece meas 52 (56, 60) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Next RS (bind-off) row: Selvage st, bind off next 5 sts, drop next st from needle and unravel down to cast-on, * bind off next 5 sts, drop next st from needle and unravel down to cast-on; rep from *, bind off last 6 sts.

Front: Work same as back.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams, leaving center 28 cm open for neck. Beg at cast-on edge, sew side seams over 31 cm, leaving rem 23 cm open for armholes. **Armhole bands:** With size 4.5 mm dpns and RS facing, pick up and k 80 sts evenly around armhole edge. Arrange sts evenly on 4 needles = 20 sts per needle, place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. Work rib patt in rnds for 5 cm. Bind off all sts in rib. **Neck trim:** With size 4.5 mm circular needle, pick up and k 88 sts evenly around neck edge. Bind off all sts kwise. **Hem trim:** With size 4.5 mm circular needle, pick up and k 168 (180, 192) sts evenly around bottom edge of body. Bind off all sts kwise.



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


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Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
