

JACKET · AMOROSO Design 05 – Lookbook 10



Size 36/38 (40/42, 44/46, 48)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 500 (500, 600, 600) g of Lana Grossa Amoroso (23% pure wool, 23% silk, 23% cotton, 23% acrylic, 8% polyamide; 400 m/100 g) in Greige/Green Beige/Light Grey/Sand (col 1). Size 5 mm needles; size 5 mm circular needle, 120 cm long; size 4 mm crochet hook.

Rib patt: P2, k2.

Main patt: Multiple of 2. Work according to chart. Numbers at right edge of chart indicate RS rows, numbers at left edge of chart indicate WS rows. Rep rows 1 – 10 for main patt.

Selvage sts: <u>On RS row</u>, ktbl first st, sl last st pwise wyib. <u>On</u> <u>WS row</u>, ptbl first st, sl last st pwise wyif.

Gauge: 20 sts and 38 rows = 10 x 10 cm in main patt on size 5 mm needles.

Note: Back and fronts are worked separately and side to side. Arrows on schematic show direction of work. Back is 9 cm longer than fronts.

Back: With size 5 mm needles cast on 64 (66, 68, 70) sts. Next row (RS): Selvage st, work main patt according to chart to last st, selvage st. Maintaining selvage sts, cont to foll chart, inc 1 st at end of next 12 RS rows, then cable cast-on 2 sts at beg of next 2 WS rows, 3 sts at beg of next WS row, 27 sts at beg of next WS row = 110 (112, 114, 116) sts. Work increased sts into main patt. Work even for 52 (56, 60, 64) cm, ending with a RS row. Cont in patt and at beg of WS rows, bind off 27 sts 1 time, 3 sts 1 time, 2 sts 2 times, then dec 1 st at end of next 12 RS rows = 64 (66, 68, 70) sts. Work even until piece meas 68 (72, 76, 80) cm from cast-on, ending with a chart row 6. Bind off all sts.

Left front: With size 5 mm needles cast on 64 (66, 68, 70) sts. Next row (RS): Selvage st, work main patt according to

chart to last st, selvage st. Maintaining selvage sts, cont to foll chart, inc 1 st at end of next 12 RS rows, then cable cast-on 2 sts at beg of next 2 WS rows, 3 sts at beg of next WS row, 27 sts at beg of next WS row = 110 (112, 114, 116) sts. Work increased sts into main patt. Work even for 15 (17, 19, 21) cm, ending with a chart row 6. Bind off all sts.


Right front: With size 5 mm needles cast on 110 (112, 114, 116) sts. Next row (RS): Selvage st, work main patt according to chart to last st, selvage st. Maintaining selvage sts, cont to foll chart until piece meas 15 (17, 19, 21) cm from cast-on, ending with a RS row. Cont in patt and at beg of WS rows, bind off 27 sts 1 time, 3 sts 1 time, 2 sts 2 times, then dec 1 st at end of next 12 RS rows = 64 (66, 68, 70) sts. Work even until piece meas 23 (25, 27, 29) cm from cast-on, ending with a chart row 6. Bind off all sts.

Sleeves and yoke: With size 5 mm needles cast on 52 sts for right sleeve. Next row (RS): Selvage st, work main patt according to chart to last st, selvage st. Maintaining selvage sts, cont to foll chart, inc 1 st at each end of 5th row from cast-on, then every 8th row 11 times, then every alt 6th and 8th row 6 times = 88 sts. Work increased sts into main patt. Work even until piece meas 59 (61, 63, 65) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Next row (RS): Bind off 34 sts, patt to end. Cont in patt across rem 54 sts until piece meas 70 (72, 74, 76) cm from cast-on. Marker last WS row to indicate center of yoke. Work left half of yoke and left sleeve same as right half of yoke and right sleeve, reversing all shaping and when piece meas 70 (72, 74, 76) cm from marker, bind off rem 52 sts after a chart row 6.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Using size 4 mm crochet hook, join pieces with sc from RS as foll: Matching 5 to 5 and 6 to 6, join yoke to back. Matching 3 to 3 and 4 to 4, join left front to yoke. Matching 1 to 1 and 2 to 2, join right front to yoke. Close side and sleeve seams. Front and neckband: With size 5 mm circular needle and RS facing, pick up and k 400 sts along right front, back neck and left front edge. Next row (WS): Selvage st, * p2, k2; rep from * to last 3 sts, p2, selvage st. Work in rib patt as set by last row for a total of 8.5 cm. Bind off all sts in rib.

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




Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev** St st = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **sl** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot St st = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
