

PULLOVER · ALESSIA

Design 10 - Lookbook 10



Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 500 (550, 600) g of Lana Grossa Alessia (76% cotton, 20% recycled polyester, 4% polyester; 135 m/50 g) in Blue/Turquoise/Silver Grey (col 15). Size 4.5 mm needles; size 4.5 mm circular needle, 120 cm long.

Rib patt: K1, p1.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Rev St st: P on RS, k on WS.

Border patt: Row 1 (RS): Selvage st, * yo twice, k1; rep from *, end selvage st. Row 2 (WS): Selvage st, purl all sts, dropping all yos, end selvage st. Row 3 (RS): Selvage st, * insert right needle between first and 2nd st on left needle and pull loop through, knit first st on left needle; rep from *, end selvage st. Row 4 (WS): Selvage st, * p2tog loop and next st; rep from *, end selvage st. Work rows 1 – 4 twice.

Two-stitch selvage: On RS row, sl 1 pwise wyib, k1, patt to last 2 sts, k1, sl 1 pwise wyib. On WS row, p1, sl 1 pwise wyif, patt to last 2 sts, sl 1 pwise wyif, p1.

Full-fashion double decrease: At beg of RS row, two-stitch selvage, k2, sk2p; at end of RS row, work to last 7 sts, k3tog, k2, two-stitch selvage.

Full-fashion decrease: At beg of RS row, two-stitch selvage, 1 st in rev St st, skp; at end of RS row, work to last 5 sts, k2tog, 1 st in rev St st, two-stitch selvage.

Full-fashion increase: On RS row: M1R, 3 sts in from edge.

Gauge: 22 sts and 28 rows = $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$ in St st on size 4.5 mm needles.

Back: With size 4.5 mm needles cast on 121 (129, 137) sts. Next row (WS): Two-stitch selvage, work in rib patt to last 2 sts, two-stitch selvage. Next row (RS): Two-stitch selvage, work in St st to last 2 sts, two-stitch selvage. Maintaining sel-

vage sts, cont in St st until piece meas 32 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape armholes: Working full-fashion dbl dec, dec 2 sts at each end of next 5 RS rows = 101 (109, 117) sts. Maintaining selvage sts, cont in St st until armhole meas 20 (21, 22) cm, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 5 (5, 6) sts 1 time, then 5 sts 4 times, 6 sts 1 time (then 6 sts 5 times / then 6 sts 2 times, 7 sts 3 times). Bind off rem 39 sts.

Left front: With size 4.5 mm needles cast on 91 (95, 99) sts. Next row (WS): Two-stitch selvage, work in rib patt to last 2 sts, two-stitch selvage. Next row (RS): Two-stitch selvage, work in St st to last 3 sts, 1 st in rev St st, two-stitch selvage. Work in patt as set by last row until piece meas 5 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape front slope: Working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at end of next RS row, then every alt 2nd and 4th row 43 (45, 47) times, then every alt row 6 (4, 2) times. At same time, when same length as back to armhole, shape armhole at right edge same as for back and when same length as back to shoulder, shape shoulder at right edge same as for back. No sts rem.

Right front: Work same as left front, reversing all shaping and patt placement.


Sleeves: With size 4.5 mm needles cast on 56 sts. Purl 1 WS row. Working a two-stitch selvage at each edge in place of a single selvage st, work in border patt for 8 rows. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st and shape sleeve as foll: Working full-fashion inc, inc 1 st at each end of 11 (9, 9)th row, then every 10th row 6 times, then every 8th row 5 times (then every 8th row 13 times / then every alt 6th and 8th row 15 times) = 80 (84, 88) sts. Maintaining selvage sts, work even until piece meas 45 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape sleeve cap: Working full-fashion dbl dec, dec 2 sts at each end of next 5 RS rows = 60 (64, 68) sts. Work 1 WS row. Bind off all sts.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. <u>Front and neckband</u>: With size 4.5 mm circular needle, pick up and k 198 (202, 206) sts evenly along right front, back neck and left front edge. Purl 1 WS row. Work border patt for 8 rows. Bind off all sts. Lap right front over left front and sew through both thicknesses for 26 cm at cast on. Sew in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

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


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Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
