## CROCHET JACKET - ABOUT BERLIN SPOTTY & PER FORTUNA Design 25 – Filati Journal 61



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Size One size

**Materials: 250 g** of Lana Grossa **About Berlin Spotty** (55% cotton, 26% polyamide, 19% polyester; 125 m/50 g) in Charcoal Variegated **(col 8)**; **250 g** of Lana Grossa **Per Fortuna** (74% organic cotton, 26% polyamide; 190 m/50 g) in Ecru **(col 8)** and **100 g** in Rust **(col 1)**. Size 4 mm crochet hook.

**Chart A/B**: Numbers at left edge of chart indicate WS rows, numbers at right edge of chart indicate RS rows. Chart begins with a WS row. Letters and letters with numbers at right edge of chart indicate yarn used: **ABS** = About Berlin Spotty; **PF1** = Per Fortuna Rust; **PF8** = Per Fortuna Ecru. Work first sc on first row in 2nd ch from hook. Beg each row with the number of ch shown on chart. Work to patt rep, work st(s) shown in grey for patt rep, work to end of chart. Work rows 1 – 12 of chart A once; work rows 13 – 15 of chart B once, then rep rows 14 and 15.

**Stripe sequence A**: 2 rows each Charcoal Variegated, Rust, Charcoal Variegated, Ecru, Charcoal Variegated, Ecru = 12 rows.

**Stripe sequence B**: 2 rows each Ecru, Charcoal Variegated, Ecru, Charcoal Variegated, Rust, Ecru; 1 row Charcoal Variegated; 2 rows Ecru; 1 row Charcoal Variegated; 2 rows Rust; 1 row Charcoal Variegated; 3 rows Ecru; 4 rows Charcoal Variegated; 2 rows Ecru; 1 row Charcoal Variegated; 2 rows Ecru; 1 row Charcoal Variegated; 2 rows Rust; 1 row Charcoal Variegated; 3 rows Ecru; 2 rows Rust; 5 rows Charcoal Variegated; 2 rows Ecru; 1 row Rust; 5 rows Charcoal Variegated; 2 rows Ecru; 1 row Rust = 48 rows.

**Note**: To change color, work to last yarn over in old color, pick up new color and complete st with new color.

**Decreasing several sts**: At beg of row, skip the number of sts given in pattern and work sl st instead; at end of row, leave the number of sts given in pattern unworked.

Increasing 1 st: Work 2 sts in 1 st.

**Gauges**: <u>With size 4 mm hook</u>: 22.5 sts and 12 rows =  $10 \times 7$  cm in chart patt A; 22.5 sts and 9.75 rows =  $10 \times 10$  cm in chart patt B.

**Jacket**: Worked side to side in 2 halves, beginning with sleeve. Arrow on schematic shows direction of work. Left half of back and left front: With Charcoal Variegated, ch 71 + ch 1. Work chart A and stripe sequence A for 12 rows = 7 cm. Work chart B, inc 1 st at each end of next 28 rows = 127 sts and 8 patt reps. Work increased sts into patt. Work 3 rows even. Ch 42 at each end of next row for back and left front side edge = 211 sts and 14 patt reps. Work increased sts into patt. Work even to end of stripe sequence B. With Ecru only, work chart A for 10 rows = 6.5 cm. Divide for back and left front: Patt over first 105 sts and turn. Cont chart A over 105 back sts for 10 more rows and back meas 6.5 cm from divide. Fasten off. Left front: With RS facing, rejoin yarn to rem 106 sts, cont chart A and shape front neck as foll: Dec 12 sts at neck edge every row 4 times, 10 sts 5 times = 8 sts rem. Fasten off.


**Right half of back and right front**: Work same as left half of back and left front, reversing shaping.

**Finishing**: Pin pieces to measurements and block. With WS facing and Ecru, join back halves with sl st. Sew side and sleeve seams. <u>Bottom band</u>: Join Charcoal Variegated with sl st to bottom corner of left front. Beg with row 2 of chart A, work chart A and stripe sequence A for 10 rows. Work 65 sts along bottom edge of left front, 136 sts along bottom edge of back, 65 sts along bottom edge of right front = 266 sts. Fasten off. <u>Front and neckband</u>: Join Charcoal Variegated with sl st to bottom corner of right front. Beg with row 2 of chart A, work chart A and stripe sequence A for 10 rows. Work 117 sts along right front edge, 32 sts along back neck edge, 117 sts along left front edge = 266 sts. <u>At same time</u>, dc3tog at each corner where front and back neck edge meet on first, 3rd and 5th row. Fasten off.

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



Chart key:

### Gauge Swatch

#### Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
