Design 06 – Gomitolo 09

TOP
GOMITOLO SELEZIONE 2

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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44/46, 48/50)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 300 (300, 400, 400) g of Lana Grossa Gomitolo Selezione 2 (75% cotton, 25% viscose; 260 m/100 g) in Salmon/Peach/Natural/Beige/Pink (col 2001). Size 4 and 4.5 mm needles; short size 4 mm circular needle.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Main patt: Multiple of 4 + 2 selvage sts. Row 1 (RS): Selvage st, * k2, p2; rep from *, end selvage st. Row 2 (WS): Selvage st, work sts as they appear, selvage st. Row 3 (RS): Selvage st, * p2, k2; rep from *, end selvage st. Row 4 (WS): As row 2. Rep rows 1 - 4.


Gauge: 22 sts and 32 rows = $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$ in main patt on size 4.5 mm needles.

Back: With size 4 mm needles cast on 98 (106, 114, 122) sts. Beg and end with a WS row work in St st for 1 cm. Change to size 4.5 mm needles. Work in main patt until piece meas 36 (34, 32, 30) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape

armholes: Bind off 4 sts at beg of next 2 (4, 4, 6) rows, 2 sts at beg of next 4 (4, 6, 4) rows = 76 (76, 80, 84) sts. Work even for 4 rows. Dec 1 st at each end of next RS row, then every 6th row 5 times = 64 (64, 68, 72) sts. At same time, when armhole meas 17 (19, 21, 23) cm, shape neck as foll: Next row (RS): Bind off center 20 sts. Working each side separately, bind off 4 sts at each neck edge 1 time, 2 sts 3 times and when armhole meas 20 (22, 24, 26) cm, bind off rem 12 (12, 14, 16) sts for each shoulder.

Front: Work same as back until armhole meas 6 cm, ending with a WS row. Shape V-neck: Next row (RS): Divide work at center. Working each side separately, dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 20 times and when same length as back to shoulders, bind off rem 12 (12, 14, 16) sts for each shoulder.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder and side seams. Neck edging: With size 4 mm circular needle, pick up and k 130 (135, 140, 145) sts evenly around neck edge. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. Work St st in rnds (k every rnd) for 1 cm. Bind off all sts. Armhole edging: With size 4 mm circular needle, pick up and k 96 (110, 120, 130) sts evenly around armhole edge. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. Work St st in rnds (k every rnd) for 1 cm. Bind off all sts.






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Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
