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Design 09 – Classici 26

CARDIGAN PROMESSA

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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 550 (600, 650) g of Lana Grossa **Promessa** (70% organic cotton, 30% recycled polyamide; 125 m/50 g) in Cream (**col 14**) and 50 (100, 100) g in Black (**col 24**). Size 5.5 and 6 mm needles; size 5.5 mm circular needle, 120 cm long.

Rib patt: P2, k2.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Domino patt: Multiple of 2. Work according to chart. Numbers at right edge of chart indicate RS rows, numbers at left edge of chart indicate WS rows. Rep rows 1 – 4.

Stripe patt: Work 4 rows in domino patt with size 6 mm needles and Black, work 8 rows in St st with size 5.5 mm needles and Cream = 12 rows. Rep these 12 rows for stripe patt.

Selvage sts: On every row: Knit first and last st.

Full-fashion decrease: At beg of RS row, selvage st, k2, skp; at end of RS row, work to last 5 sts k2tog, k2, selvage st.

Full-fashion increase: On RS row: M1R, 2 sts in from each edge.

Gauge: 19 sts and 27 rows = 10 x 10 cm in St st on size 5.5 mm needles.

Back: With size 6 mm needles and Cream cast on 98 (104, 110) sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st; work row 2 of chart to last st; selvage st. NOTE: Selvage sts are not included on chart. Maintaining selvage sts, work chart for 6 more rows, ending with a WS row. Change to size 5.5 mm needles. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st until piece meas 20 (19, 18) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape sides: Working full-fashion inc, inc 1 st at each end of next RS row, then every alt 16th and 18th row 8 times = 116 (122, 128) sts. At same time, when piece meas 53 (52, 51) cm from cast-on, place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Next, work stripe patt for 64 rows, ending with

4 rows in domino patt. Work remainder of back in St st with size 5.5 mm needles and Cream until armhole meas 24 (25, 26) cm, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 4 sts 9 times, 5 sts 2 times (4 sts 6 times, 5 sts 5 times / 4 sts 3 times, 5 sts 8 times). Bind off rem 24 sts.

Left front: With size 6 mm needles and Cream cast on 44 (48, 52) sts. Work same as back until piece meas 20 (19, 18) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Work full-fashion incs for side shaping at right edge same as for back. At same time, on first row of side shaping (when piece meas 1 cm / 2 cm from beg of side shaping), shape neck as foll: Working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at end of next RS row, then every 24th (22nd, 20th) row 6 (7, 8) times. At same time, when same length as back to armhole, place armhole marker at right edge. Work stripe patt same as for back for 64 rows, ending with 4 rows in domino patt. Work remainder of left front in St st with size 5.5 mm needles and Cream until same length as back to shoulder. Shape shoulder at right edge same as for back. No sts rem.

Right front: Work same as left front, reversing all shaping.

Sleeves: With size 6 mm needles and Cream cast on 50 sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st; work row 2 of chart to last st; selvage st. NOTE: Selvage sts are not included on chart. Maintaining selvage sts, work chart for 6 more rows, ending with a WS row. Change to size 5.5 mm needles. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st until piece meas 23 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape sleeve: Working full-fashion inc, inc 1 st at each end of next RS row, then every alt RS row 5 (3, 1) time(s), then every foll RS row 15 (19, 23) times = 92 (96, 100) sts. Work even until piece meas 42 cm from cast-on. Bind off all sts.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. **Front and neckband:** With size 5.5 mm circular needle and Cream, pick up and k 142 sts along right front, 16 sts along back neck and 142 sts along left front edge = 300 sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, p2, * k2, p2; rep from *, end selvage st. Cont in rib patt as set by last row until band meas 5 cm from pick-up row. Bind off all sts in rib. Sew on sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams.

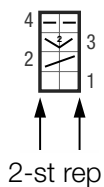




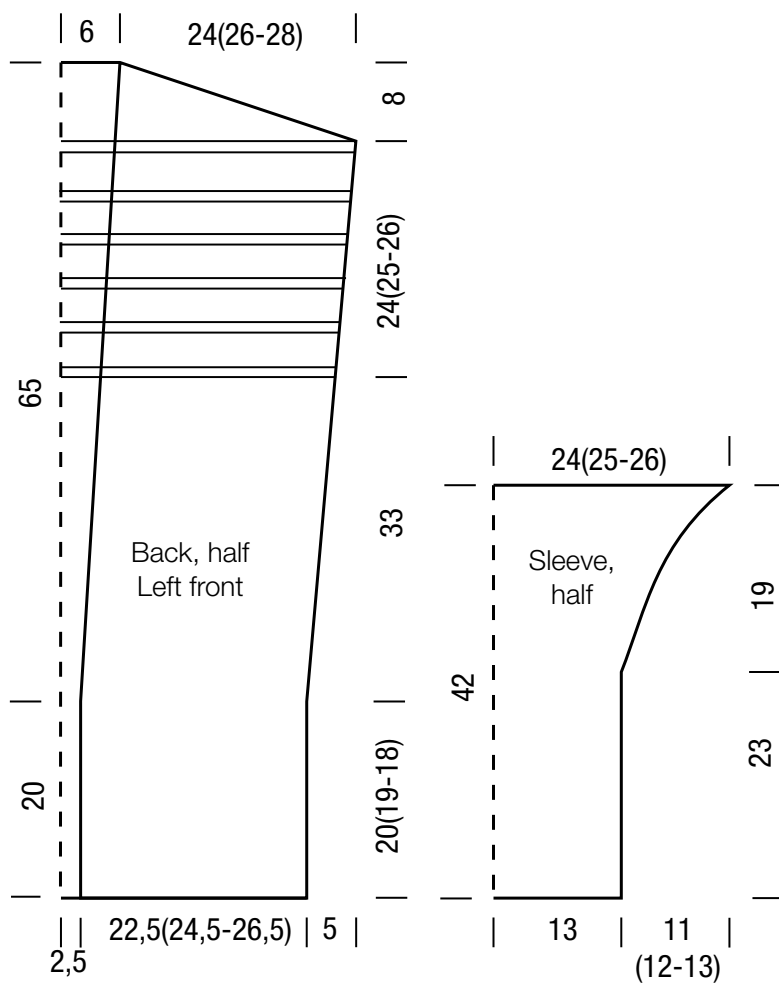


Chart key:

Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
