



JACKET • ABOUT BERLIN SPARKLY
Design 06 from Lookbook 06

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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 600 (650, 700) g of Lana Grossa About Berlin Sparkly (82% cotton, 18% polyester; 120 m/50 g) in Linen/Khaki/Dark Green/Olive (col 11). Size 4 mm needles; size 4 mm crochet hook.

Moss st: Row 1: K1, p1; Row 2: As row 1. Row 3: P1, k1. Row 4: As row 3. Rep rows 1 – 4.

Gauge: 20.5 sts and 23 rows = $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$ in moss st on size 4 mm needles.

Back: With size 4 mm needles cast on 100 (108, 116) sts. Work in moss st until piece meas 55 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape armholes: Bind off 14 st at beg of next 2 rows = 72 (80, 88) sts. Cont in moss st until piece meas 71 (73, 75) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape neck: Next row (RS): Bind off center 24 sts. Working each side separately, bind off 2 sts at each neck edge twice, 1 st once. Work even until piece meas 75 (77, 79) cm from cast-on. Bind off rem 19 (23, 27) sts for each shoulder.

Left front: With size 4 mm needles cast on 52 (56, 60) sts. **Note:** Neck shaping begins before (after / after) armhole sha-


ping; read the following section all the way through before proceeding. Work in moss st until piece meas 54 (56, 58) cm from cast-on, ending with a RS row. Shape neck: Bind off 1 st at beg of next 15 WS rows, then bind off 1 st at beg of every other WS row 4 times. At same time, when piece meas 55 cm from cast-on, shape armhole at right edge same as for back. Work even until piece meas 75 (77, 79) cm from cast-on. Bind off rem 19 (23, 27) shoulder sts.


Right front: Work same as for left front, reversing all shaping.

Sleeves: With size 4 mm needles cast on 43 (47, 51) sts. Work in moss st and shape sleeve as foll: Inc 1 st at each end of 5th from cast-on, then every 6th row 12 (6, 2) times, then every 4th row 3 (12, 18) times = 75 (85, 93) sts. Work increased sts into patt. Work even until piece meas 48 cm from cast-on. Bind off all sts.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. With size 4 mm hook work 1 row sc along right front, back neck and left front edge. Set sleeves into armholes, sewing top 7 cm to bottom edges of armhole shaping. Sew side and sleeve seams.

Note: Jacket length in instructions is shorter than jacket length in photo.








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Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
