

JACKET · FOURSEASON

Design 09 from Filati Classici 16

Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 400 (450, 500) g of Lana Grossa Fourseason (45% extrafine Merino wool, 40% organic cotton, 15% recycled cashmere; 105 m/50 g) in Green/Grey (col 5). Size 5.5 mm needles; three 18 mm mother-of-pearl buttons [by Union Knopf, item 37604, col 12].

Seed st: Even number of sts. Row 1: Selvage st, * k1, p1; rep from *, end selvage st. Row 2: Selvage st, purl the knit sts and knit the purl sts, selvage st. Rep row 2 for seed st.

Selvage sts: K1 at beg and end of every row.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Full-fashion dec: At beg of RS row, selvage st, k2, skp; at end of RS row, work to last 5 sts, k2tog, k2, selvage st.

Gauges: On size 5.5 mm needles: 16 sts and 21 rows = 10 x 10 cm in St st; 16 sts and 24 rows = 10 x 10 cm in seed st.

Back: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 78 (84, 90) sts. Work in seed st until piece meas 6 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Work in St st until piece meas 23 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Work in seed st for 6 cm, ending with a WS row. Work in St st until piece meas 38 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape armholes: Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 4 rows, 1 st at beg of next 2 rows. Working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at each end of next 3 RS rows = 62 (68, 74) sts. Work even in St st until piece meas 58 (59, 60) cm from cast-on. Bind off all sts.

Pocket lining: Make 2 alike. With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 16 sts. Beg with a WS row, work in St st for 9 cm, ending with a RS row. Cut yarn. Place sts on holder.


Left front: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 46 (48, 52) sts. Work in seed st until piece meas 6 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Next row (RS): Selvage st, work 37 (39, 43) sts in St st, work seed st over next 7 sts, selvage st = 8 sts for front band. Cont in patt as established until piece meas 15 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Next row (RS): Selvage st, work 10 (12, 14) sts in St st, work seed st over next 16 sts for pocket trim, patt to end. Cont in patt as established until pocket trim meas 3 cm, ending with a WS row. Next row (RS): Selvage st, work 10 (12, 14) sts in St st, bind off next 16 sts for pocket opening, patt to end. Next row (WS): Patt to bound-off sts, then with WS of pocket lining facing, purl 16 pocket lining sts from holder, work to end. Cont in patt as established across all sts until piece meas 23 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Work in seed st across all sts for 6 cm, ending with a WS row. Maintaining seed st for front band and working rem sts in St st, work even until piece meas 33 (34, 35) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Next row (RS): Selvage st, work 36 (38, 42) sts in St st, work seed st over next 8 sts, selvage st. Cont in this manner, working 1 st less in St st and 1 additional st in seed st every 4th row 12 more times. At

<u>same time</u>, when same length as back to armhole, shape armhole at right edge same as for back = 38 (40, 44) sts. Work even until piece meas 58 (59, 60) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Next row (RS): Bind off 17 (19, 23) shoulder sts = 21 sts rem for collar. Cast on 1 st at right edge of collar = 22 sts and cont in patt across collar sts for 8.5 cm. Bind off all sts.

Right front: Work same as for left front, reversing all shaping and patt placement and working 3 buttonholes at beg of RS rows as foll: Selvage st, work seed st over 2 sts, [yo k2tog] for buttonhole, patt to end. Next row (WS): Work in patt, k or p the yo as needed to stay in patt. Work first buttonhole when piece meas 20 (21, 22) cm from cast-on and rem 2 buttonholes spaced 6 cm apart.

Sleeves: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 34 sts. Work in seed st until piece meas 6 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Work in St st and shape sleeve as foll: Inc 1 st at each end of 9 (9, 7)th row, then every alt 6th and 8th row 9 times (then every 8th row twice, then every 6th row 8 times / then every 6th row 10 times, then every 4th row twice) = 54 (56, 60) sts. Work even until piece meas 43 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape sleeve cap: Bind off 2 (3, 3) sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 2 (2, 4) rows. Working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at each end of next 16 (16, 15) RS rows. Work 1 WS row. Bind off rem 14 (14, 16) sts.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. Join right and left collar and sew to back neck, reversing top 4 cm of seam for the turnback of the collar to the right side. Sew in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams. Sew pocket linings in place on WS. Sew on buttons.





Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations
