

SHAWL · CAPRI, STROMBOLI & SILKHAIR Design 15 from Filati Tücher & Co. 03

Size approx. 122 cm wide x 156 cm long

Materials: 100 g of Lana Grossa Capri (55% cotton, 30% polyamide, 15% silk; 150 m/50 g) in Dark Grey (col 10), 100 g of Lana Grossa Stromboli (60% cotton, 15% viscose, 15% polyamide, 10% silk; 150 m/50 g) in Aubergine/Charcoal (col 104) and 75 g of Lana Grossa Silkhair (70% mohair, 30% silk; 210 m/25 g) in Aubergine (col 107). Size 4.5 and 6 mm circular needle.

2 selvage sts: Sl 1 pwise wyif, k1, patt to last 2 sts, sl 1 pwise wyif, k1.

Garter st: K every row.

Feather-and-fan patt: Multiple of 17 + 4 selvage sts. Rows 1 and 2: 2 selvage sts, knit to last 2 sts, 2 selvage sts. Row 3: 2 selvage sts, * k2tog 3 times, [yo, k1] 5 times, yo, k2tog 3 times; rep from * to last 2 sts, 2 selvage sts. Row 4: 2 selvage sts, purl all sts and yos, end with 2 selvage sts. Rep rows 1 - 4.


Gauge: 17 sts and 28 rows = 10×10 cm in garter st on size 4.5 mm needles.

Shawl: With size 6 mm circular needle and Capri, cast on 208 sts. Change to size 4.5 mm circular needle. Work in featherand-fan patt until piece meas approx. 12 cm from cast-on, ending with a patt row 2. * Break Capri, join Silkhair. Next dec row: 2 selvage sts, work in garter st to last 4 sts, skp, 2 selvage sts. Next row: Maintaining selvage sts, work even in garter st. Rep last 2 rows until a total of 46 rows (= 23 garter ridges) have been worked. Break Silkhair, join Stromboli. Maintaining selvage sts and decreases as established, work in garter st for 32 rows (= 16 garter ridges). Break Stromboli, join Capri. Maintaining selvage sts and decreases as established, work in garter st for 12 rows (= 6 garter ridges). Rep from * twice more = 3 x 90 rows (= 45 garter ridges). Break Capri, join Silkhair. Maintaining selvage sts and decreases as established, work in garter st until 7 sts rem. Work 1 WS row. Next row (RS): K2tog, k3tog, skp = 3 sts. Next row (WS): K3tog. Fasten off last st.

Finishing: Carefully weave in all ends. Pin piece to measurements and block.



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




Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev** St st = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **sl** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot St st = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
