

PULLOVER · TREFILI

Design 09 - Filati Journal 59



Size 36 – 40 (42 – 46, 48/50)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 350 (400, 450) g of Lana Grossa Trefili (62% cotton, 26% viscose, 12% linen; 160 m/50 g) in Mauve/Rosewood (col 3). Size 3.5 and 4.5 mm needles; size 4.5 mm circular needle, 100 cm long; size 4 mm crochet hook.

Selvage stitches: On every row: SI first st kwise, k last st.


St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Gauge: 20 sts and 28 rows = 10×10 cm in St st on size 4.5 mm needles.

Pullover: Back and front are worked in one piece and side to side, beginning at left sleeve. Arrow on schematic shows direction of work. With size 3.5 mm needles cast on 58 (62, 66) sts. Next row (RS): Selvage st, 27 (29, 31) sts in St st, plm, 2 sts in St st, plm, 27 (29, 31) sts in St st, selvage st. Next row (WS): Work even. Next RS (inc) row: Work to marker, M1R, slm, k2, slm, M1R, work to end = 60 (64, 68) sts. Next row (WS): Work even. Change to size 4.5 mm needles. Cont in St st, rep inc row every alt RS row 31 more times. At same time, after 74 rows = 26 cm have been worked from cast-on, shape sides as foll: Cast on 10 (11, 11) sts at beg of next 8 rows, 12 (10, 12) sts at beg of next 2 rows. Change to circular needle when necessary. After all incs have been worked, you will have 226 (234, 242) sts on the needle. Work even until 46 (52, 58) rows have been worked from last side cast-on row = 16.5

(18.5, 20.5) cm. Divide for back and front: Next row (RS): Work across first 113 (117, 121) sts and turn, leaving rem 113 (117, 121) sts on hold. Back: Cont across back sts only for 25 more rows and back neck meas 9.5 cm. Place sts on holder, do not cut yarn. Front: Return 113 (117, 121) held front sts to needle and with RS facing, join new ball of yarn. Shape neck: At beg of RS rows, bind off 4 sts 1 time, 2 sts 3 times, 1 st 3 times = 100 (104, 108) sts. Work even for 13 more rows and front neck meas 9.5 cm. Place sts on holder, cut yarn. Next RS (joining) row: Return 113 (117, 121) held back sts and 100 (104, 108) held front sts to needle = 213 (221, 229) sts. Work 2nd half of back and front same as first half, reversing all shaping: Work incs and cast on to shape right half of front neck edge, work decs to shape sleeve/overarm and bind off to shape sides. Work sleeve/overarm decs as foll: Work to 2 sts before marker, k2tog, slm, k2, slm, skp, work to end. Work last 5 rows of right sleeve with size 3.5 mm needles. Loosely bind off all sts.

Finishing: Pin piece to measurements and block. Sew side and sleeve seams. <u>Neck trim</u>: With size 4 mm crochet hook work 1 rnd sl st around neck edge.






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Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
