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PULLOVER · CERTO
Design 28 – Filati Journal 59

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Size 36 – 40 (42 – 46, 48/50)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 500 (550, 600) g of Lana Grossa **Certo** (100% GOTS cotton; 115 m/50 g) in Black/Blue (**col 7**). Size 5.5 and 7 mm needles; size 4.5 mm circular needle, 50 cm long.

Selvage stitches: On every row: Sl first st kwise, k last st.

Garter st: K every row.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Gauge: 16 sts and 20 rows = 10 x 10 cm in St st on size 7 mm needles.

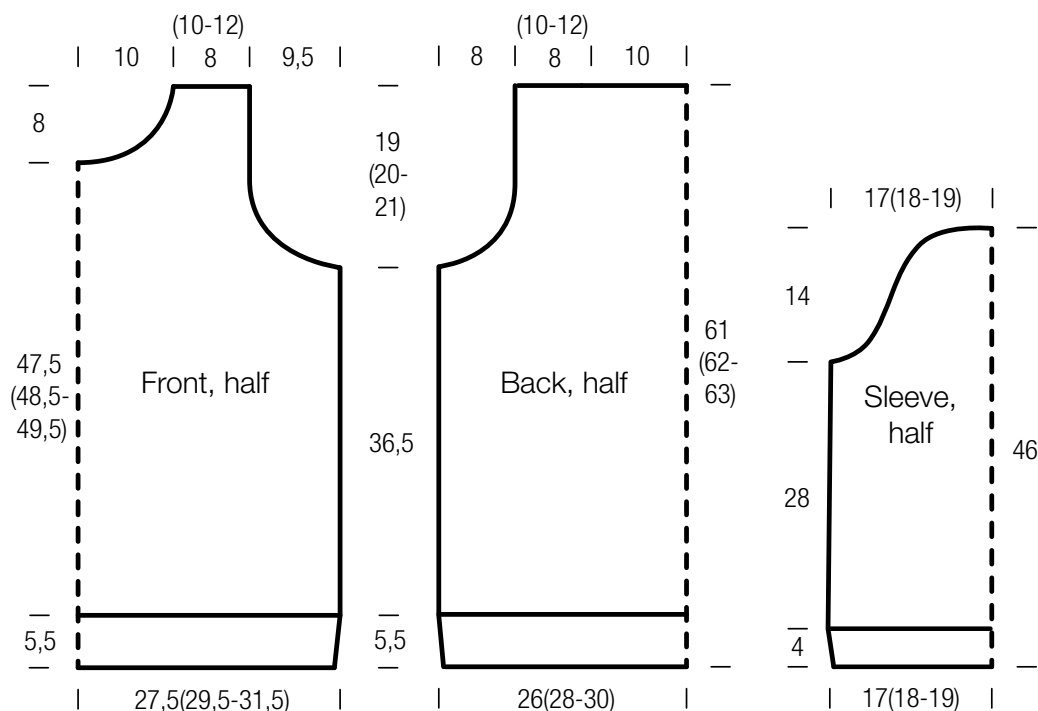
Back: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 86 (92, 98) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working a selvage st at each edge, work in garter st for 19 rows and piece meas 5.5 cm from cast-on. Change to size 7 mm needles. Maintain selvage sts throughout. Work in St st for 74 rows = 36.5 cm. Shape armholes: Bind off 4 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 4 rows, 1 st at beg of next 4 rows = 60 (66, 72) sts. Work even until 38 (40, 42) rows have been worked from beg of armhole shaping and armhole meas 19 (20, 21) cm. Bind off all sts. Mark center 32 sts for neck.

Front: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 90 (96, 102) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working a selvage st at each edge, work in garter st for 19 rows and piece meas 5.5 cm

from cast-on. Change to size 7 mm needles. Maintain selvage sts throughout. Work in St st until same length as back to armholes. Shape armholes: Bind off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 3 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 4 rows, 1 st at beg of next 6 rows = 60 (66, 72) sts. Work even until 22 (24, 26) rows have been worked from beg of armhole shaping and armhole meas 11 (12, 13) cm. Shape neck: Next row (RS): Bind off center 14 sts. Working each side separately, bind off 4 sts at each neck edge 1 time, 2 sts 1 time, 1 st 3 times and when same length as back to shoulders, bind off rem 14 (17, 20) sts for each shoulder.

Sleeves: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 56 (60, 64) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working a selvage st at each edge, work in garter st for 13 rows and piece meas 4 cm from cast-on. Change to size 7 mm needles. Maintain selvage sts throughout. Work in St st for 56 rows = 28 cm. Shape sleeve cap: Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 4 rows, 1 st at beg of next 20 rows, 2 sts at beg of next 4 rows. Bind off rem 20 (24, 28) sts.

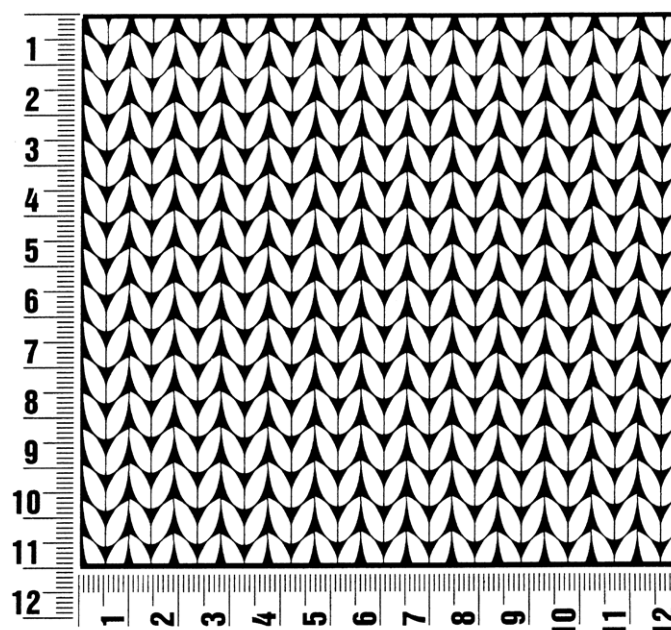
Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. **Neckband:** With size 4.5 mm circular needle and RS facing, pick up and k 74 sts evenly around neck edge. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. P 1 rnd, k 1 rnd, p 1 rnd. Bind off all sts. Sew in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams, leaving bottom 5.5 cm of side seams open for vents.



Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
