

TOP · ABOUT BERLIN BULKY Design 35 – Filati Journal 59



Size 36/38 (40/42)

Instructions are given for smaller size. Figure in parenthesis refers to larger size. When only one figure is given, it applies to both sizes.

Materials: 450 (500) g of Lana Grossa **About Berlin Bulky** (50% cotton, 50% Micromodal; 47 m/50 g) in Ink **(col 4)**. Size 10 mm needles; size 9 and 10 mm circular needles, each 60 cm long; size 9 mm crochet hook.

Selvage stitches: <u>On every row</u>: SI first st kwise, k last st. Work first and last st on every row as a selvage st throughout.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Full-fashion increase: <u>On RS row</u>: M1R, 1 st in from each edge.

Full-fashion decrease: Skp before marker, k2tog after marker.


Gauges: 9.5 sts and 15 rows = 10×10 cm in St st on size 10 mm needles; 10 sts and 16.5 rows = 10×10 cm in St st on size 9 mm needles.

Back: With size 10 mm needles cast on 48 (52) sts. K 1 WS row. Work in St st until piece meas 35 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape armholes: Bind off 2 sts at beg of next 2 rows, 1 st at beg of next 6 rows = 38 (42) sts. Work even until armhole meas 10 cm, ending with a WS row. Next RS (inc) row: Working full-fashion inc, inc 1 st at each end of row = 40 (44) sts. Cont in St st, rep inc row every foll RS row 2 more times = 44 (48) sts. Work even until armhole meas 17 (18) cm, ending with a WS row. Place sts on holder.

Front: Work same as back.

Yoke and funnel neck: Return back and front sts to size 10 mm circular needle = 88 (96) sts. Place marker and join in the rnd. Rnd 1: K44 (48), place 2nd marker, k to end = 1 marker at left and right shoulder line. Work St st in rnds (k every rnd) for 2 rnds. Next dec rnd: Work in St st and working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st before and after each marker = 4 sts decreased and 84 (92) sts rem. Cont in St st, rep dec rnd every alt rnd 4 (5) more times = 68 (72) sts. Change to size 9 mm circular needle. Work even for 18 cm. Loosely bind off all sts.

Finishing: Pin piece to measurements and block. With size 9 mm crochet hook work 1 rnd sl st around each armhole edge. Sew side seams.






Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev** St st = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **sl** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot St st = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
