

VEST · PIMA Design 11 – Filati Classici 18



Size 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 400 (450, 500) g of Lana Grossa Pima (100% Pima cotton; 125 m/50 g) in Petrol (col 17). Size 4 mm needles.

Texture rib: <u>Row 1 (WS)</u>: Two-stitch selvage, knit to last 2 sts, two-stitch selvage. <u>Row 2 (RS)</u>: As row 1. <u>Row 3 (WS)</u>: Two-stitch selvage, * k1, p1tbl; rep from * to last 3 sts, k1, two-stitch selvage. <u>Row 4 (RS)</u>: Two-stitch selvage, * p1, k1tbl; rep from * to last 3 sts, p1, two-stitch selvage. <u>Row 5</u> (<u>WS)</u>: As row 3. <u>Row 6 (RS)</u>: As row 4. Work rows 1 – 6 three times, then work rows 1 – 4 once more = 22 rows.

Slip stitch edging: <u>Row 1 (WS)</u>: * K1, p1; rep from *. <u>Row 2</u> (<u>RS)</u>: * Sl 1 pwise wyib, p1; rep from *. Rep rows 1 and 2 for slip st edging.

Rev St st: P on RS, k on WS.

Two-stitch selvage: <u>On RS row</u>, sl 1 pwise wyib, k1, patt to last 2 sts, k1, sl 1 pwise wyib. <u>On WS row</u>, p1, sl 1 pwise wyif, patt to last 2 sts, sl 1 pwise wyif, p1.

Pocket trim: <u>Row 1 (RS)</u>: Knit. <u>Row 2 (WS)</u>: As row 1. <u>Row 3 (RS)</u>: * K1tbl, p1; rep from *, end k1tbl. <u>Row 4 (WS)</u>: * P1tbl, k1; rep from *, end p1tbl. <u>Row 5 (RS)</u>: As row 3. <u>Row 6 (WS)</u>: As row 4. <u>Row 7 (RS)</u>: As row 1. <u>Row 8 (WS)</u>: As row 2.

Full-fashion increase: <u>On RS row</u>: M1L, 2 sts in from each edge; <u>on WS row</u>: M1R, 2 sts in from each edge.

Gauge: 21 sts and 27 rows = 10 x 10 cm in rev St st on size 4 mm needles; 24 sts of slip st edging = 9 cm wide.

Back: With size 4 mm needles cast on 121 (129, 137) sts. Beg with a WS row work in texture rib for 22 rows. Maintaining two-stitch selvage at each edge work in rev St st until piece meas 19 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape sleeves: Working full-fashion inc, inc 1 st at each end of next 9 rows = 139 (147, 155) sts. Cast on 14 sts at beg of next 2 rows = 167 (175, 183) sts and position sts as foll: Two-stitch selvage, work slip st edging over next 14 sts, work in rev St st over next 135 (143, 151) sts, work slip st edging over next 14 sts, two-stitch selvage. Cont in patt as set by last row until piece meas 41 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Bind off 14 sts at beg of next 2 rows = 139 (147, 155) sts. Shape shoulders with short-rows as foll: <u>Row 1 (RS)</u>: Two-stitch selvage, p7, turn. <u>Row 2</u>: Yo, k7, two-stitch selvage. <u>Row 3</u>: Two -stitch selvage, p7, ptog tbl yo and next 2 sts, work to last 11 sts, p2tog, p7, two-stitch selvage. <u>Row 4</u>: Two -stitch selvage, k7, turn. <u>Row 5</u>: Yo, p7, two-stitch selvage. <u>Row 6</u>: Two -stitch selvage, k7, ktog tbl yo and next 2 sts, work to last 11 sts, k2tog, p7, two-stitch selvage. Rep rows [1 – 6] 20 (22, 24) more times = 42 (46, 50) sts decreased at each edge. Bind off rem 55 sts.

Pocket lining: Make two. With size 4 mm needles cast on 33 sts and work in rev St st for 12 cm, ending with a WS row. Place sts on holder, cut yarn.


Left front: With size 4 mm needles cast on 79 (83, 87) sts. Next row (WS): Two-stitch selvage, work slip st edging over next 24 sts, work texture rib over next 51 (55, 59) sts, twostitch selvage. Work in patt as set by last row for a total of 22 rows. Next row (WS): Two-stitch selvage, work slip st edging over next 24 sts, work in rev St st over next 51 (55, 59) sts, two-stitch selvage. Work in patt as set by last row for 10 cm, ending with a WS row. Next RS (pocket opening) row: Two-stitch selvage, work next 8 (10, 12) sts in rev St st, work pocket trim over next 33 sts, work next 10 (12, 14) sts in rev St st, work slip st edging over next 24 sts, two-stitch selvage. Work in patt as established, work rows 2 – 8 of pocket trim. Next RS (pocket joining) row: Patt over first 10 (12, 14) sts, with RS of pocket lining facing, work in rev St st over 33 sts of lining, patt to end. Cont in patt across all sts until piece meas 19 cm, ending with a WS row. Shape sleeve at right edge same as for back = 102 (106, 110) sts and when piece meas 22.5 (24, 25.5) cm from cast-on, shape neck as foll: Next RS (dec) row: Patt to last 28 sts, p2tog, patt to end. Cont in patt, rep dec row every 6th row 2 times, then every 4th row 15 times = 18 sts decreased and when same length as back to shoulder, shape shoulder at right edge same as for back = 28 sts rem for collar. Cont in patt across collar sts for 13 cm, ending with a WS row. Place sts on holder.

Right front: Work same as left front, reversing all shaping and patt placement.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder, side and sleeve seams, working all seams 1 st in from edge. <u>Collar</u>: Return collar sts to 2 needles. With wrong sides tog, needles held parallel and using 3rd needle, join sts using 3-needle bind-off. Sew collar edge to back neck. Sew pocket linings in place on WS.

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




Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev** St st = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **sl** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot St st = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
