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## **TOP · CERTO PRINT** Design 11 – Linea Pura 14



#### Size 36/38 (40/42)

Instructions are given for smaller size. Figure in parenthesis refers to larger size. When only one figure is given, it applies to both sizes.

**Materials: 250 (300) g** of Lana Grossa **Certo Print** (100% cotton; 115 m/50 g) in Beige/Salmon/Blackberry/Aubergine **(col 108)**. Size 6.5 and 8 mm needles.

**Chart patt**: Numbers at left edge of chart indicate WS rows, numbers at right edge of chart indicate RS rows. Chart begins with a WS row. Work to patt rep, work 2 sts between arrows for patt rep, work to end of chart. Sts shown in grey are worked as two-stitch selvage. Work rows 1 - 4 once, then rep rows 3 and 4. <u>Note</u>: 1 stitch and 1 yo are treated as 1 stitch.

**Full-fashion decrease**: <u>At beg of RS row</u>, patt over 3 sts (= two-stitch selvage, p1), k2tog; <u>at end of RS row</u>, work to last 5 sts, k2tog tbl, patt to end (= p1, two-stitch selvage).


**Gauge**: 18 sts and 23 rows = 10 x 10 cm in chart patt on size 8 mm needles.


**Back**: With size 6.5 mm needles cast on 87 (95) sts. Beg with a WS row, work chart patt for 2 rows. Change to size 8 mm

needles. Cont to foll chart and shape sides as foll: Working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at each end of 22nd row from caston, then every 6th row 5 times = 75 (83) sts. Cont in patt until a total of 87 rows has been worked and piece meas 38 cm from cast-on. Shape armholes: Bind off 5 sts at beg of next 2 rows. Working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at each end of next 5 RS rows = 55 (63) sts. <u>At same time</u>, on last row of armhole shaping (on next RS row after armhole shaping) and armhole meas 4 (5) cm, shape neck as foll: Next row (RS): Bind off center 27 sts. Working each side separately and working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 5 times and when 28 rows = 12 cm have been worked from beg of neck shaping, bind off rem 9 (13) sts for each shoulder.

**Front**: Work same as back until a total of 77 (79) rows has been worked and piece meas 33 (34) cm from cast-on. Shape neck: Next row (RS): Bind off center 21 sts. Working each side separately and working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 8 times and when same length as back to shoulders, bind off rem 9 (13) sts for each shoulder.

**Finishing**: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder and side seams, sewing 1 st in from edge.



## Gauge Swatch

#### Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
