

# JACKET • ABOUT BERLIN FUNKY \& BRIGITTE NO. 4 Design 18 - About Berlin 09 

Size 34/36 (38/40)
Instructions are given for smaller size. Figure in parenthesis refers to larger size. When only one figure is given, it applies to both sizes.

Materials: $\mathbf{3 0 0} \mathbf{( 3 5 0 )} \mathbf{g}$ of Lana Grossa About Berlin Funky ( $83 \%$ cotton, $17 \%$ polyamide; $115 \mathrm{~m} / 50 \mathrm{~g}$ ) in Gentian Blue (col 11) and 350 (400) g of Lana Grossa Brigitte No. 4 (80\% cotton, $20 \%$ baby alpaca; $110 \mathrm{~m} / 50 \mathrm{~g}$ ) in Grey/Blue (col 17). Size 5 and 7 mm needles; size 5 and 6 mm circular needles, each 100 cm long.

Note: Work with 1 strand of each yarn held tog throughout = 2 strands held tog.

Selvage sts: On every row: $K$ first st, sl last st pwise wyif.
2x2 rib: $\mathrm{K} 2, \mathrm{p} 2$.
1x1 rib: K1, p1.
St st: K on RS, p on WS.
Gauge: 13 sts and 18 rows $=10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}$ in St st with size 7 mm needles and 2 strands held tog.

Back: With size 5 mm needles and 2 strands held tog cast on 66 (70) sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, p1, * k2, p2; rep from * to last 4 sts, k2, p1, selvage st. Work in 2x2 rib as set by last row until piece meas 3.5 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Change to size 7 mm needles. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st for 8 rows, decreasing 2 (0) sts on first row $=64$ (70) sts. Shape sides: Inc 1 st at each end of next RS row, then every 10th row 2 times $=70$ (76) sts. Work even until piece meas 22 cm from end of rib patt, ending with a WS row. Shape armholes: Bind off 1 st at beg of next 8 rows = 62 (68) sts. Work even until armhole meas 20 (21) cm, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 5 sts 1 time, 4 (5) sts 3 times. Bind off rem 28 sts.

Left front: With size 5 mm needles and 2 strands held tog cast on 29 (33) sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, * k2, p2; rep from * to last 4 sts, k2, p1, selvage st. Work in $2 \times 2$ rib as set by last row until piece meas 3.5 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Change to size 7 mm needles. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st for 8 rows, increasing 1 (0) st on first row = 30 (33) sts. Cont in St st, work incs for side shaping at right edge same as for back $=33$ (36) sts. Work even until piece meas 21 (22) cm from end of rib patt, ending with a RS row. Shape neck (NOTE: Neck shaping begins 1 cm before beg of
armhole shaping (1 row after beg of armhole shaping): Bind off 1 st at beg of next 3 WS rows, then every alt WS row 9 times. At same time, when same length as back to armhole, shape armhole at right edge same as for back and when same length as back to shoulders, shape shoulders same as for back. No sts rem.

Right front: Work same as left front, reversing all shaping and patt placement.

Sleeves: With size 5 mm needles and 2 strands held tog cast on 33 sts. Work 1 WS row in $1 \times 1$ rib. Change to size 7 mm needles. Work in St st and shape sleeve as foll: Inc 1 st at each end of 5th row, then every 6th row 10 (11) times $=55$ (57) sts. Work even until piece meas 42 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape sleeve cap: Bind off 1 st at beg of next 8 rows. Loosely bind off rem 47 (49) sts.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. Front and neckband and collar: With size 5 mm circular needle, pick up and k 33 (35) sts along straight edge and 37 sts along shaped edge of right front, 28 sts along back neck, 37 sts along shaped edge and 33 (35) sts along straight edge of left front = 168 (172) sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, * p2, k2; rep from * to last 3 sts, p2, selvage st. Work in $2 \times 2$ rib as set by last row for a total of 7 rows. Bind off 33 (35) sts at beg of next 2 rows $=102$ sts rem for collar. Cont in $2 \times 2$ rib across collar sts for 10 rows. Change to size 6 mm circular needle. Cont in $2 x 2$ rib for 12 rows. Loosely bind off all sts in rib. Sew in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.

## Gauge Swatch

## Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. $12 \mathrm{~cm} \times 12 \mathrm{~cm}$. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm . If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
