# COWL · LACE SETA MULBERRY

## Design 16 – Tücher & Co. 05



**Size** approx. 30 cm wide, 110 cm in circumference

**Materials:** 100 g each of Lana Grossa **Lace Seta Mulberry** (35% Mulberry silk, 35% baby Alpaca, 30% superfine Merino wool; 175 m/50 g) in Yellow (**col 10**), Dark Grey (**col 15**) and Gey Green (**col 13**). Size 3.5 mm circular needle, 80 cm long; size 3.5 mm needles; cable needle [cn].

**Garter st in rnds:** Purl 1 rnd, knit 1 rnd.

**16-st cable:** Work according to chart. Numbers at right edge of chart indicate RS rows; on WS rows, work sts as they appear. Work rows [1 – 26] 18 times = 468 rows; 20-st cable border = 4 cm wide.


**Stripe sequence:** [8 rnds Dark Grey, 2 rnds Yellow, 8 rnds Dark Grey, 8 rnds Grey Green, 2 rnds Yellow, 8 rnds Grey Green = 36 rnds] 3 times = 108 rnds.

**Gauge:** 20 sts and 48 rnds = 10 x 10 cm in garter st on size 3.5 mm needles.


**Cowl:** With size 3.5 mm needles and Yellow cast on 20 sts for cable border. Next row (RS): K2, work row 1 of chart over next 16 sts, k2. Next row (WS): Sl 2 pwise wyif, work row 2 of chart over next 16 sts, sl 2 pwise wyif. Maintaining 2 edge sts as established, cont to follow chart for a total of 468 rows and piece meas approx. 110 cm. Graft live sts on needle to cast-on sts. With RS facing, beg and end at seam, with size 3.5

mm circular needle and Dark Grey, pick up and k 220 sts along left edge of cable border, picking sts up 1 st in from edge. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. Work garter st in rnds and follow stripe sequence for 108 rnds. Cut yarn. Turn work to WS, work and attach 2nd cable border to body as foll: Using Yellow, backloop cast on 20 sts at beg of rnd (= right needle tip). Sl 1 st to left needle, p2tog (1 st in Yellow and 1 st in Grey Green). Turn work. Next row (RS): Sl 1 st from right needle to left needle, k2tog (= 1 st in Grey Green and 1 st in Yellow), k1, work 16-st cable, k2, turn work. **Row 1 (WS):** Sl 2 pwise wyif, work 16-st cable, sl 3 pwise wyif (= 2 sts in Yellow, 1 st in Grey Green), turn work. **Row 2 (RS):** K2tog (1 st in Grey Green and 1 st in Yellow), k1, 16-st cable, k2, turn work. Rep rows 1 and 2 until entire border is attached. Graft ends of border tog.

**Finishing:** Pin piece to measurements and block.

□ = k1


◻ = p1

= sl 8 sts to cn and hold in back of work, work next 8 sts as they appear, then work 8 sts from cn as they appear.

## Gauge Swatch

### Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
