CROCHET BAG · THE PAPER

Design 15 – „The“ Flyer



Size approx. 22 x 30 x 3 cm

Materials: 300 g of Lana Grossa **The Paper** (70% polyester, 30% viscose; 100 m/100 g) in Jeans (**col 8**). Size 7 mm crochet hook.

Motif [approx. 15 x 30 cm]: Worked in rows according to chart. Ch 3, sl st in first ch to form ring. Numbers at bottom of chart indicate rows. **Row 1:** Ch 3, 6 dc into ring. Turn, ch2, work row 2. **Rows 3 – 7:** Work dc groups into ch-sp on row below. **Row 4:** Work dc and sc between dc on row below. Work rows 1 – 8 once. End with 1 row sl st.

Single crochet [sc] in rows: Beg each row with ch 1 (does not count as sc).

Gauge: 9 sc and 9.5 rows = 10 x 10 cm with size 7 mm hook.

Bag: First, work motif according to chart for bag flap. At end of sl st row, work sc along straight edge of motif for 3 rows = 3 cm, working 27 sc across each row. Place marker to indicate beg of back. Cont in sc for 21 rows = 22 cm. Place marker to indicate end of back/beg of bottom. Cont in sc for 3 rows = 3 cm. Place marker to indicate end of bottom/beg of front. Cont in sc for 21 rows = 22 cm. Fasten off.

Strap: Ch 132 + ch 1. Working first sc on first row in 2nd ch from hook, work sc in rows for 3 rows = 3 cm. Fasten off.



Finishing: Fold piece at bottom markers [see dashed lines on schematic]. Attach strap to bag with sl st as foll: Beg at top edge of front, work down to bottom, work across bottom, work up to top edge [see photo 1 and 2]. Attach opposite edge of strap in the same way to back edges of bag.

Fringe: For each fringe, cut 2 strands of yarn, each strand approx. 25 cm long. Insert crochet hook into fabric from WS, fold 2 strands of yarn in half to form a loop, draw loop through fabric, then draw yarn ends through loop and tighten. Attach fringe evenly spaced along bag flap. Trim fringe to 12 cm.





Chart key:


- = chain (ch)

- = single crochet (sc)
- † = double crochet (dc)
-  = [1 dc, ch 1, 1 dc] in same st and/or sp
-  = [1 dc, ch 3, 1 dc] in same st and/or sp
-  = 6 dc in same st and/or sp



Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) · **ch** = chain · **cont** = continue · **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) · **inc** = increas(e)(ing) · **k** = knit · **kwise** = as if to knit
meas = measures · **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop · **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop · **patt** = pattern · **pm** = place marker · **p** = purl
pwise = as if to purl · **rem** = remain(ing) · **rep** = repeat(s) · **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch · **rnd(s)** = round(s) · **RS** = right side · **sc** = single crochet · **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch · **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch · **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch · **sl** = slip · **st(s)** = stitch(es) · **St st** = stockinette stitch · **tbl** = through the back loop · **tog** = together · **wyib** = with yarn in back of work · **wyif** = with yarn in front of work · **WS** = wrong side · **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
