### PULLOVER

**Size** 36/38 (40/42 - 44/46 - 48/50)

The information for size 40/42 is in parentheses before, for size 44/46 between, and for size 48/50 after the dividing lines. If only one information is given, it applies to all sizes.

**Material:** Lana Grossa quality "Cashmere 16 Fine" (80% virgin wool (Merino), 10% cashmere, 10% polyamide, running length = approx. 320 m/50 g): approx. **200 (200 - 250 - 250) g** red (**color 22**), approx. **100 (100 - 150 - 150) g** dark red (**color 11**); knitting needles no. 3.5 and 4.5; 1 short circular knitting needle no. 3.5.

**Double edge stitch (over 2 sts):**

Beginning of row: Slip st pwise, k 1.

End of row: Slip st pwise, k edge st.

**Rib pattern:** k2, p2 alternately, and end with k2.

All following rows: Work all sts as they appear.

**Stockinette stitch:** K on RS, p on WS

**Selvedge stitch:**

Beginning of row: Slip st pwise.

End of row: K 1.

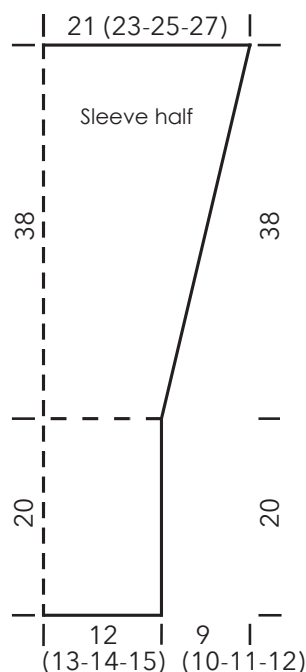
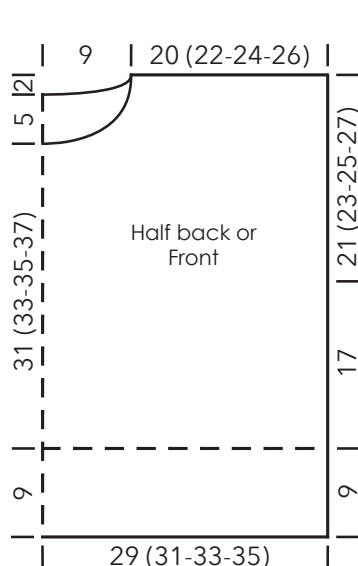
**Gauge:** 23 sts and 31 rows in St st with size 4.5 needles = 10 x 10 cm.

**Back:** Cast on 138 (146 - 154 - 162) sts with dark red and size 3.5 needles and work 9 cm between each 2 double edge sts in the rib pattern. Continue with size 4.5 needles and work in St st between each selv st. 17 cm from the rib pattern, mark the beginning of the armholes on both sides. At 19 (21 - 23 - 25) cm from the beginning of the armholes, cast off the middle 32 sts for the neckline and finish each side separately, dec 1 st 5 times on each row for the neckline. At 21 (23 - 25 - 27) cm from the beginning of the armholes, cast off the remaining 48 (52 - 56 - 60) sts for the shoulders on both sides in an RS row.

**Front:** Knit as the back, but in red and with a deeper neckline. 14 (16 - 18 - 20) cm from the start of the armholes, cast off the middle 18 sts for the neckline and finish both sides separately. To round the neckline, cast off 3 sts once, 2 sts 3 times and 1 st 3 times on every 2nd row.

**Sleeves:** Cast on 58 (62 - 66 - 70) sts each with red and 3.5 mm needles and work 20 cm between each selv st in rib. Continue with 4.5 mm needles in St st between each selv st, inc 1 st in every 6th (alternating every 6th and 4th - alternating every 6th and 4th - every 4th) row 19 (21 - 23 - 25) times = 96 (104 - 112 - 120) sts. Cast off all sts at 38 cm from the rib.

**Finishing:** Sew the shoulder seams on the outside. Using the circular needle, pick up 104 st in red from the neckline and work in 2.5 cm rib, then cast off. Sew the side seams, leaving the hem cuffs open for the slits. Sew the sleeve seams and sew the sleeves on the outside.

## GAUGE SWATCH

Before you begin knitting...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast on and bind off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
