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Design 26 – Lookbook 16

CROCHET HOODIE
ALTA MODA COTOLANA

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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44/46, 48/50)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 500 (550, 600, 650) g of Lana Grossa **Alta Moda Cotolana** (45% Merino wool, 45% Pima cotton, 10% polyamide; 150 m/50 g) in Raspberry (col 53). Size 4 mm crochet hook.

Single crochet [sc] in rows: Beg each row with ch 1.

Decreases: At beg of row, skip 1 st and work ch instead; at end of row, sc2tog last 2 sts.

Increases: Work 2 sc in 1 sc on row below.

Gauge: 23 sc and 28 rows = 10 x 10 cm with size 4 mm hook.


Back: With size 4 mm hook, ch 114 (124, 134, 144). Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each ch across. Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Rep row 2 until piece meas 34 (33, 32, 31) cm from beg. Shape armholes: Dec 1 st at each end of next 7 (8, 9, 10) rows = 100 (108, 116, 124) sc. Work even until armhole meas 17 (19, 21, 23) cm. Shape neck: Leave center 26 sts unworked. Working each side separately, dec 1 st at each neck edge every row 7 times and when armhole meas 20 (22, 24, 26) cm, fasten off.

Front: Work same as back until armhole meas 13 (15, 17, 19) cm. Shape neck: Leave center 12 sts unworked and pm in first unworked st. Working each side separately, dec 1 st at each neck edge every row 14 times and when same length as back to shoulders, fasten off.

Sleeves: With size 4 mm hook ch 80 (90, 100, 110). Row 1: Ch 1, sc in each ch across. Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Rep row 2 until piece meas 2 cm from beg. Shape sleeve cap: Dec 1 st at each end of every row until piece meas 11 (13, 15, 17) cm from beg. Fasten off.

Finishing: Sew shoulder seams. Sew in sleeves. Sew side and sleeve seams.


Hood: With size 4 mm hook, RS facing, beg and end at marked st, work 110 sc around neck edge, then work 1 sc in back of first 12 sc at beg of rnd. Turn, work sc in rows, increasing 10 sts evenly every alt row 4 times = 150 sc. Work even until piece meas 25 cm from beg. Pm at center of work. Next dec row: Sc2tog before and after m. Rep dec row every alt row 14 times = 120 sc. Fold hood in half. Close seam with a row of sl st from WS. Work 1 row sl st around entire front edge of hood.



Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.

pwise = as if to purl · **rem** = remain(ing) · **rep** = repeat(s) · **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch · **rnd(s)** = round(s) · **RS** = right side · **sc** = single crochet · **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch · **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch · **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch · **sl** = slip · **st(s)** = stitch(es) · **St st** = stockinette stitch · **tbl** = through the back loop · **tog** = together · **wyib** = with yarn in back of work · **wyif** = with yarn in front of work · **WS** = wrong side · **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
