

Design 08 – Lookbook 17

COAT GIGANTE

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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44/46, 48/50, 52/54)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 500 (500, 600, 600, 700) g of Lana Grossa Gigante (70% fine alpaca, 30% polyamide; 300 m/100 g) in Antique Pink/Blackberry/Light Olive/Dark Olive (col 10). Size 5.5 and 6 mm needles.

Rib patt: * P1, k1; rep from *.

Two-stitch selvage: At beg of row, sl 1 pwise wyif, k1. At end of row, sl 1 pwise wyif, k1.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Gauge: 13 sts and 18 rows = $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$ in St st on size 6 mm needles.

Back: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 80 (86, 92, 98, 104) sts. Working a two-stitch selvage at each edge work in St st for 6 rows, ending with a WS row. Change to size 6 mm needles. Maintaining two-stitch selvage cont in St st until piece meas 30 cm from cast-on. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate top of split hem. Omitting two-stitch selvage cont in St st for 46 (44, 42, 40, 38) cm. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Cont until piece meas 20 (22, 24, 26, 28) cm from armhole markers, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 5 sts 6 times (5 sts 3 times, 6 sts 3 times / 6 sts 6 times). Bind off rem 20 sts.

Pocket lining: Make 2. With size 6 mm needles cast on 22 (23, 24, 25, 26) sts. Work in St st for 15 (15.5, 16, 16.5, 17) cm, ending with a WS row. Place sts on holder, cut yarn.

Left front: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 59 (62, 65, 68, 71) sts. Next row (RS): Two-stitch selvage, work next 49 (52, 55, 58, 61) sts in St st, work next 6 sts in rib patt, two-stitch selvage. Work in patt as set by last row for a total of 6 rows, ending with a WS row. Change to size 6 mm needles. Cont in patt as established until piece meas 30 cm from cast-on. Place marker in last st on last WS row to indicate top of split hem. Omitting two-stitch selvage at right edge, cont in patt for 20 cm, ending with a RS row. Next WS (pocket opening) row: Patt over first 25 (26, 27, 28, 29) sts, bind off next 20 (21, 22, 23, 24) sts kwise, patt to end. Next RS (pocket joining) row: K13 (14, 15, 16, 17); with RS of pocket lining facing, k2tog last body st and first st of lining; knit to last st of lining, k2tog last st of lining and next body st, patt to end = 59 (62, 65, 68, 71) sts. Cont in patt across all sts until same length as back to armhole. Place armhole marker at right edge. Cont until same length as back to shoulder. Shape shoulder at right edge same as for back = 29 sts rem for neckband. Cont in patt across neckband sts for 9 cm. Bind off all sts.

Right front: Work same as left front, reversing all shaping and patt placement.


Sleeves: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 42 (46, 50, 54, 58) sts. Work in St st for 6 rows, ending with a WS row. Change to size 6 mm needles. Cont in St st and shape sleeve as follows: Inc 1 st at each end of every 12th row 5 times (every 10th row 6 times / every alt 8th and 10th row 7 times / every 8th row 8 times / every alt 6th and 8th row 9 times) = 52 (58, 64, 70, 76) sts. Work even until piece meas 43 (42, 41, 40, 39) cm from cast-on. Bind off all sts.


Finishing: Sew pocket linings in place on WS. Sew shoulder seams. Sew bound-off edges of neckbands tog, then sew neckband to back neck. Sew on sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams, leaving bottom 30 cm of side seams open for split hem.

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




Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
