

Design 19 – Lookbook 17

PULLOVER ALPACA AIR

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Size 36/38 (42/44, 46/48, 52/54)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: **300 (300, 350, 350)** g of Lana Grossa **Alpaca Air** (62% baby alpaca, 11% fine Merino wool, 27% polyamide; 140 m/50 g) in Pastel Blue **(col 28)**. Size 4 and 4.5 mm needles; short size 4 mm circular needle.

Rib patt: Selvage st, * k1, p1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k1, selvage st.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Chart patt: Multiple of 10 + 1. Numbers at right edge of chart indicate RS rows; on WS rows, work sts as they appear, purl all yos. Work 5 sts to patt rep, rep 10-st patt rep, work 6 sts to end of chart. Rep rows 1 - 16.


Gauges: 15 sts and 20 rows = $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$ in chart patt on size 4.5 mm needles; 16 sts and 21 rows = $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$ in rib patt on size 4 mm needles, measured slightly stretched.


Back: With size 4 mm needles cast on 93 (103, 113, 123) sts. Work in rib patt for 6 cm, ending with a WS row. Change to size 4.5 mm needles. Work chart for 33 cm. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Cont in patt until piece meas 16 (18, 20, 22) cm from armhole markers, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 4 (5, 6, 7) sts 5 times. Bind off rem 53 sts.

Front: Work same as back to shoulder shaping. Shape shoulders same as for back. At same time, on first row of shoulder shaping, shape neck as foll: Bind off center 33 sts. Working each side separately, bind off 4 sts at each neck edge 1 time, 3 sts 1 time, 2 sts 1 time, 1 st 1 time. No sts rem.

Shoulder gusset: Make 2. With size 4 mm needles cast on 75 (83, 91, 99) sts. Work in rib patt for 7 cm, ending with a WS row. Bind off 26 (30, 34, 38) sts at beg of next 2 rows = 23 sts. Cont in rib patt over rem 23 sts for 15 (18, 21, 23) cm. Bind off all sts.

Finishing: Sew shoulder gussets to back and front, matching A to A, B to B and C to C. Sew side seams. <u>Collar</u>: With size 4 mm circular needle, pick up and k 108 sts evenly around neck edge. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. K1, p1 around until collar meas 16 cm. Loosely bind off all sts in rib. Fold collar in half to WS and sew down.




Chart key:

skp: sl 1 kwise, k1, pass slipped st over knitted st


= s2kp: sl 2 kwise, k1, pass slipped sts over knitted st



Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
