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Design 57 – Filati Journal 68

**PULLOVER
SUPERKID SETA**

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Size 36/38 (40/42, 44/46, 48/50, 52/54)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: 125 (125, 150, 150, 175) g of Lana Grossa Superkid Seta (65% superkid mohair, 35% silk; 100 m/25 g) in White (col 1) and 175 (200, 200, 225, 225) g in Light Grey (col 2). Size 4 and 4.5 mm needles; size 4 mm circular needle, 60 cm long.

Rib patt: P1, k1.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Full-fashion decrease: At beg of RS row, selvage st, k2, skp; at end of RS row, work to last 5 sts, k2tog, k2, selvage st.

Gauge: 16 sts and 24 rows = 10 x 10 cm in St st on size 4.5 mm needles.

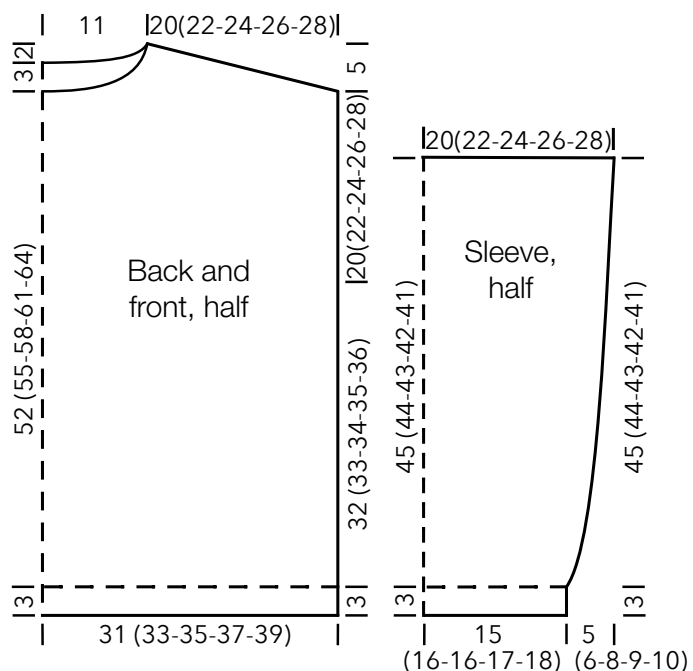
Back: With size 4 mm needles and Light Grey cast on 100 (106, 112, 118, 124) sts. Work in rib patt for 3 cm, ending with a WS row. Change to size 4.5 mm needles Work in St st for 32 (33, 34, 35, 36) cm. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Cont until piece meas 20 (22, 24, 26, 28) cm from armhole markers, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders and neck: At each shoulder edge bind off 5 sts 5 times, 6 sts 1 time (5 sts 2 times, 6 sts 4 times / 6 sts 5 times 7 sts 1 time / 6 sts 2 times, 7 sts 4 times / 7 sts 5 times, 8 sts 1 time). At same time, when working 4th RS shoulder bind-off row, work neck as foll: Bind off center 20 sts. Working each side separately, bind off 4 sts at each neck edge 1 time, 5 sts 1 time. No sts rem.

Front: Work same as back to shoulder shaping. Shape shoulders same as for back. At same time, on first row of shoulder shaping, shape neck as foll: Bind off center 28 sts. Working each side separately and working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 5 times. No sts rem.

Right sleeve: With size 4 mm needles and White cast on 48 (50, 52, 54, 56) sts. Work in rib patt for 3 cm, ending with a WS row. Change to size 4.5 mm needles Next row (RS): Work in St st, increasing 8 (10, 12, 14, 16) sts evenly across row = 56 (60, 64, 68, 72) sts. Cont in St st and shape sleeve as foll: Inc 1 st at each end of 17 (13, 11, 9, 9)th row from end of rib patt, then every 18th row 4 times (then every alt 16th and 14th row 5 times / then every 12th row 6 times / then every alt 12th and 10th row 7 times / then every 10th row 8 times) = 66 (72, 78, 84, 90) sts. Work even until piece meas 45 (44, 43, 42, 41) cm from end of rib patt. Bind off all sts.

Left sleeve: Work same as right sleeve, working first 7.5 cm after rib patt in White, next 6 rows in Light Grey, next 12 rows in White, next 8 rows in Light Grey, remainder in White.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. **Collar:** With size 4 mm circular needle and Light Grey, pick up and k 95 sts evenly around neck edge. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. K 14 rnds. Change to White, k22 rnds. Loosely bind off all sts. Fold collar in half to WS and sew down. Sew on sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams.



Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
