SWEATER



Size 32/34 (36/38 - 40/42 - 44/46 - 48/50 - 52/54)

The information for size 32/34 is in front, the information for all other sizes in brackets separated by dashes. If there is only one specification, it applies to all sizes.

The model has a total length of 54 (54 - 57 - 57 - 60 - 60) cm, and a bust measurement of 16 cm by 80 cm chest circumference (16 cm by 88 cm chest circumference - 16 cm by 96 cm chest circumference - 16 cm by 104 cm chest circumference - 12 cm by 116 cm chest circumference - 8 cm by 128 cm chest circumference).

The back and front parts up to the armhole are knitted in the round, the sleeves are knitted in the round from top to bottom directly to the back and front pieces. Only work with double yarn.

MATERIALS

Lana Grossa SILKHAIR

70 % Mohair, 30% Silk

Length: approx. 210 m / 25 g

- 250 (250 250 275 275 -300) g rost (col 181)
- Circular knitting needle nr. 4 and 5 / each 40 and 80 (80-80 100 100)
 100) cm
- Double pointed needle nr. 4
- Cable needle
- Stitch marker

PATTERN

Stockinette st in rnd: K all sts.

Reverse stockinette st in rnd: P all sts

Ribbing pattern in rnd: K 2 sts, p 2 sts alternately

Cable pattern: Look Diagram. Repeat the 16 sts in width and the 1st - 12th row/round in height.

In row: Only the RS-Rows are drawn, p all sts on the WS-Row.

In rnd: Only the odd rnds are drawn, k all sts in the intermediate rounds.

Slipped st edge: Slip the 1st st on each row purlwise (with yarn in front of the st), k the last st on each row.

Note: Only work with double yarn.

GAUGE

20 sts and 22 rows in cable pattern with needle nr. $5 = 10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$

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Cast on 192 (208-224 - 240 - 256 - 272) sts with needle nr. 4. Close to rnd and mark the begin of the rnd and the middle of the rnd*. Work 6 cm in ribbing pattern, then switch to needle nr. 5 and continue in cable pattern*. After a total height of 34 (34 - 37 - 37 - 39 - 39) cm divide the work on the markings = each 96 (104-112 - 120 - 128 - 136) sts. Finish the back and front parts separately.

Back part: In the 1st row, inc 1 st each on the right and left edges = 98 (106-114-122-130-138) sts. Work the increased sts as slipped st edge, continue working over the remaining sts in a cable pattern in row. After a total heoght of 48 (48-51-51-54-54) cm cast of the middle 24 (24-28-28-32-32) sts for the neckline. Finish both halves separately and cast off 1x 4 sts, 1x 3 sts, 1x 2 sts and 2x 1 sts at the edge of the neckline on every 2nd row. Then cast off the remaining 26 (30-32-36-38-42) sts at once.

Front part: In the 1st row, inc 1 st each on the right and left edges = 98 (106-114-122-130-138) sts. Work the increased sts as slipped st edge, continue

working over the remaining sts in a cable pattern in row. After a total height of 42 (42 - 45 - 45 - 48 - 48) cm cast off the middle 16 (16 - 18 - 18 - 18 - 18) sts for the neckline. Finish both halves separately and cast off 1x 3 sts, 2x 2 sts and 8x 1 st (1x 3 sts, 2x 2 sts and 8x 1 st - 1x 3 sts, 2x 2 sts and 9x 1 st - 1x 3 sts, 2x 2 sts and 9x 1 st - 2x 3 sts , 2x 2 sts and 8x 1 st - 2x 3 sts , 2x 2 sts and 8x 1 st) at the edge of the neckline on every 2nd row. Then cast off the remaining 26 (30 - 32 - 36 - 38 - 42) sts at once.


Finishing 1: Close shoulder seams.


Double neckline: With the short circular knitting needle nr. 4, pick up 40 (40-44 - 44 - 48 - 48) sts from the back and 56 (56-60 - 60 - 64 - 64) sts from the front edge of the neckline = 96 (96 - 104 - 104 - 112 - 112) sts. P 1 rnd, k 1 rnd and work 6 rnds in ribbing pattern. In the 7th rnd ribbing pattern *k 2 sts, p 2 sts together* repeat from * continuously = 72 (72 - 78 - 78 - 84 - 84) sts. Work 2 rnds in this division (k 2, p 1 alternately). On the following rnd, double all p sts (= p 1 and p 1 twisted out of each p st) = 96 (96 - 104 - 104 - 112 - 112) sts. Work 8 rnds in ribbing pattern, then (after a total of 20 rnds) cast off all sts loosely. Fold the neck band inwards and sew it on, making sure that the seam is not tight.

Sleeve: Pick up 80 (80 - 80 - 96 - 96) sts from the sleeve opening with the short circular knitting needle nr. 5 and work cable pattern in the rnd for 38 (38 - 38 - 36 - 36 - 36) cm. Now work 2 rnds in stockinette st, decreasing 6 (16 - 16 - 16 - 24 - 24) sts on the 1st rnd and another 16 sts evenly on the 2nd rnd = 48 (48 - 48 - 48 - 56 - 56) sts.

Switch to needle nr. 4 and work 6 cm in ribbing pattern. Then cast off all sts loosely.

Finishing 2: Stretch the sweater, moisten it and let it dry.





= Slip 4 sts to cable needle in front of work, k 4 sts, k the 4 sts from the cable needle




*For a better overview, mark the individual repeats with st markers. In this case, it is recommended to use different colored st markers for the beginning and middle of the rnd.

GAUGE

Do a Gauge! To do this, knit a 12×12 cm piece in the pattern of your chosen model. Then count stitches and rows in the 10×10 cm area. If there are fewer stitches than stated in the instructions: Knit tighter or use thinner needles ($\frac{1}{2}$ to full needle size). If you counted more stitches: Try to cast more loosely or use thicker needles.

Attention: Knitting works vary. Therefore, the gauge information on the banderoles of the wool should not be viewed as binding. In addition, these are always created on the stockinette pattern. For perfect work, the gauge in the desired pattern is a must. So that your desired model not only looks beautiful, but also fits!
