PULLOVER



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Size 34/36 (38/40, 42/44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: **350 (400, 450) g** of Lana Grossa **Luna** (88% extrafine Merino wool, 12% polyamide; 95 m/50 g) in Light Grey **(col 9)**. Size 5.5 and 6 mm needles; size 5.5 mm circular needle, 50 cm long.

Selvage stitches: On every row: SI first st kwise, k last st. Work first and last st as selvage sts throughout.

Rev St st: P on RS, k on WS.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Full-fashion decrease: At beg of RS row, selvage st, k2, skp; at end of RS row, work to last 5 sts, k2tog, k2, selvage st.

Full-fashion increase: On RS row: M1R, 3 sts in from each edge.


Gauge: 13.5 sts and 24 rows = 10×10 cm in St st on size 6 mm needles.

Back: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 65 (70, 75) sts. Beg and end with a WS row work in rev St st for 3 rows and piece meas 1 cm from cast-on. Change to size 6 mm needles and work in St st for 48 rows = 20 cm. Next row (RS): Work in St st, M1R, 5 sts in from each edge = 67 (72, 77) sts. Cont in St st until a total of 62 (68, 72) rows = 26 (28, 30) cm has been worked in St st. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Cont in St st for 42 (44, 46) rows and piece meas 17 (18, 19) cm from armhole markers. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 5 (5, 6) sts 1 time, then 5 sts 2 times, 4 sts 2 times (then 5 sts 4 times / then 6 sts 2 time, 5 sts 2 times). Bind off rem 21 (22, 21) sts.

Front: Work same as back until 8 (10, 12) rows have been worked from armhole markers and piece meas 3 (4, 5) cm from markers. Shape V-neck: Next row (RS): Bind off center sts (divide work at center / bind off center st). Working each side separately and working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at each neck edge every alt RS row 10 (9, 10) times, then every foll RS row 0 (2, 0) times and when same length as back to shoulders, shape shoulders same as for back. No sts rem.

Sleeves: With size 5.5 mm needles cast on 32 (34, 37) sts. Beg and end with a WS row work in rev St st for 3 rows and piece meas 1 cm from cast-on. Change to size 6 mm needles. Work in St st and shape sleeve as foll: Working full-fashion inc, inc 1 st at each end of 9th row, then every 12th row 7 times = 48 (50, 53) sts. Cont in St st until a total of 102 rows has been worked in St st = 42 cm. Loosely bind off all sts.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. Neck edging: With size 5.5 mm circular needle, pick up and k 70 sts evenly around neck edge. Rnd 1: Knit to end of rnd and at same time, bind off all sts. Sew on sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams.



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
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Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
