

JACKET · SILKHAIR

Design 18 - Filati Journal 63



Size 36/38 (40/42, 44/46)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

Materials: **125** (**150**, **175**) **g** of Lana Grossa **Silkhair** (70% superkid mohair, 30% silk; 210 m/25 g) in Mandarin (**col 161**) and **100** (**125**, **150**) **g each** in White (**col 117**) and Antique Pink (**col 174**). Size 4.5 and 5 mm needles.

Note: Work with 2 strands held tog as given in instructions.

Selvage sts: On every row: SI first st kwise, k last st.

Two-stitch selvage: At beg of rows, sl 1 pwise, k1; at end of rows, sl 1 pwise, k1.

Rib patt: K1, p1.

St st: K on RS, p on WS.

Full-fashion decrease: At beg of RS row, two-stitch selvage, 11 sts in rib patt, k2tog; at end of RS row, work to last 15 sts, skp, 11 sts in rib patt, two-stitch selvage.

Skp: Sl 1 kwise, k1, pass slipped st over knitted st.

Color sequence A: 28 rows with 2 strands Mandarin held tog, 28 rows with 1 strand Mandarin and 1 strand Antique Pink held tog, 28 rows with 2 strands Antique Pink held tog, 28 rows with 1 strand Antique Pink and 1 strand White held tog, rem rows with 2 strands White held tog.

Color sequence B: 20 rows with 2 strands Mandarin held tog, 20 rows with 1 strand Mandarin and 1 strand Antique Pink held tog, 20 rows with 2 strands Antique Pink held tog, 20 rows with 1 strand Antique Pink and 1 strand White held tog, 20 rows with 2 strands White held tog.

Gauge: 19 sts and 23 rows = 10×10 cm in St st with size 5 mm needles and 2 strands held tog.

Back: With size 4.5 mm needles and 2 strands Mandarin held tog, cast on 108 (114, 122) sts. Beg and end with a WS row

and working first and last st as selvage sts, work in rib patt for 13 rows and piece meas 5 cm from cast-on. Change to size 5 mm needles. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st and foll col sequence A for 78 rows and piece meas 34 cm from end of rib patt. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Cont for 50 (52, 56) rows and piece meas 22 (23, 24) cm from armhole markers. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 6 sts 7 times (6 sts 4 times, 7 sts 3 times / 7 sts 7 times). Bind off rem 24 sts.

Left front: With size 4.5 mm needles and 2 strands Mandarin held tog, cast on 61 (65, 69) sts. Next row (WS): Two-stitch selvage; beg with p1 work in rib patt to last st, selvage st. Work in rib patt as set by last row for a total of 13 rows and piece meas 5 cm from cast-on. Change to size 5 mm needles. Next row (RS): Selvage st, 47 (51, 55) sts in St st, 11 sts in rib patt as established, two-stitch selvage. Work in patt as set by last row and foll col sequence A for 78 rows and piece meas 34 cm from cast-on. Place marker in last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armhole. Cont for 4 rows and piece meas 2 cm from armhole marker. Shape neck: Working full-fashion dec, dec 1 st at end of next RS row, then every 10th row 5 times and when same length as back to shoulder, shape shoulder as foll: At beg of RS rows, bind off 5 sts 1 time, 6 sts 6 times (6 sts 4 times, 7 sts 3 times / 7 sts 7 times) = 14 sts rem for neckband. Cont in patt over neckband sts for 6 cm, ending with a WS row. Place sts on holder.

Right front: Work same as left front, reversing all shaping and patt placement.


Sleeves: With size 4.5 mm needles and 2 strands Mandarin held tog, cast on 43 (45, 47) sts. Beg and end with a WS row and working first and last st as selvage sts, work in rib patt for 19 rows and piece meas 7 cm from cast-on. Change to size 5 mm needles. Next row (RS): Selvage st, kf&b in each st across, end selvage st = 84 (88, 92) sts. Maintaining selvage sts, work in St st and foll col sequence B for a total of 100 rows and piece meas 43 cm from end of rib patt. Bind off all sts.

Finishing: Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. Graft neckbands tog, then sew neckband to back neck. Sew on sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams.

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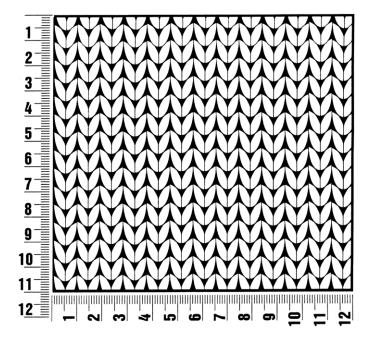

Gauge Swatch

Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



Abbreviations

beg = begin(ning) \cdot **ch** = chain \cdot **cont** = continue \cdot **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) \cdot **inc** = increas(e)(ing) \cdot **k** = knit \cdot **kwise** = as if to knit **meas** = measures \cdot **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop \cdot **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop \cdot **patt** = pattern \cdot **pm** = place marker \cdot **p** = purl **pwise** = as if to purl \cdot **rem** = remain(ing) \cdot **rep** = repeat(s) \cdot **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch \cdot **rnd(s)** = round(s) \cdot **RS** = right side \cdot **sc** = single crochet \cdot **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch \cdot **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch \cdot **s1** = slip \cdot **st(s)** = stitch(es) \cdot **St st** = stockinette stitch \cdot **tbl** = through the back loop \cdot **tog** = together \cdot **wyib** = with yarn in back of work \cdot **wyif** = with yarn in front of work \cdot **WS** = wrong side \cdot **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
