## Design 10 - Filati Journal 68



**Size** 36 – 40 (42 – 46)

Instructions are given for smaller size. Figure in parenthesis refers to larger size. When only one figure is given, it applies to both sizes.

Materials: 300 (400) g of Lana Grossa Gigante (70% fine alpaca, 30% polyamide; 300 m/100 g) in Purple/Khaki/ Umbra/Dark Violet/Grey Purple (col 4). Size 6 mm needles; size 6 mm circular needle, 50 cm long.

**Selvage stitches**: On every row: SI first st kwise, k last st.

Rib patt: K1, p1.

**Full-fashion dbl decrease**: At beg of RS row, selvage st, 4 sts in rib patt, k3tog tbl.

**Full-fashion dbl increase**: At beg of RS row, selvage st, 5 sts in rib patt, [k1,p1, k1] in next st.

**Gauge**: 13 sts and 19 rows =  $10 \times 10 \text{ cm}$  in rib patt on size 6 mm needles.

**Sleeves and yoke**: Worked side to side. Arrow on schematic shows direction of work. Loosely cast on 34 (38) sts for **left sleeve**. Next row (RS): Selvage st, \* p1, k1; rep from \*, end selvage st. Work in rib patt as set by last row until piece meas 7 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Next RS (inc) row: Selvage st, 3 (5) sts in rib patt, [(k1, p1, k1) in next st, p1] 14 times, 1 (3) st(s) in rib patt, selvage st = 62 (66) sts. Cont in rib patt for 39 cm. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate end of sleeve/beg of yoke. Cont in rib patt for 22 (24) cm, ending with a WS row. Divide for back and front: Next row (RS): Patt over 31 (33) sts and turn, leaving rem 31 (33) front sts on hold. **Back**: Bind off 2 sts at beg of next WS

row = 29 (31) sts. Cont in rib patt until back meas 20 cm from divide, ending with a RS row. Cable cast-on 2 sts at beg of next WS row = 31 (33) sts. Work 1 RS row. Place sts on holder, cut yarn. Front: Return held 31 (33) front sts to needle and with RS facing rejoin yarn. Next row (RS): Bind off 6 sts at beg of row, patt to end. Working full-fashion dbl dec, dec 2 sts at beg of next 3 RS rows = 19 (21) sts. Work even for 13 cm, ending with a WS row. Working full-fashion dbl inc, inc 2 sts at beg of next 3 RS rows = 25 (27) sts. Cable cast-on 6 sts at beg of next RS row = 31 (33) sts. Join front and back: Next row (WS): Work in rib patt as established over 31 (33) front sts and 31 (33) held back sts = 62 (66) sts. Cont in rib patt across all sts until piece meas 22 (24) cm from joining row. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate end of yoke/beg of sleeve. Cont in rib patt for 39 cm, ending with a WS row. Next RS (dec) row: Selvage st, 3 (5) sts in rib patt, [k3tog, p1] 14 times, 1 (3) st(s) in rib patt, selvage st = 34(38) sts. Cont in rib patt for 7 cm. Bind off all sts in rib.

**Back**: Worked from the top down. Arrow on schematic shows direction of work. With RS facing, pick up and k 86 (90) sts evenly between markers in bottom edge of back yoke. Work in rib patt for 38 cm. Loosely bind off all sts in rib.


**Front**: Worked from the top down. Arrow on schematic shows direction of work. With RS facing, pick up and k 86 (90) sts evenly between markers in bottom edge of front yoke. Work in rib patt for 38 cm. Loosely bind off all sts in rib.

**Finishing**: Pin piece to measurements and block. Sew side and sleeve seams. <u>Collar</u>: With circular needle, pick up and k 54 sts evenly around neck edge. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. Work in rib patt for 13 cm. Loosely bind off all sts in rib.



### Gauge Swatch

#### Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
