



# COSY LOOKS No. 2 - Design 4

## PULLOVER



### Size 32/34 (36/38 - 40/42 - 44/46 - 48/50 - 52/54)

The information for size 32/34 is in front, for all other sizes separated by dashes within the brackets. If only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. The pullover is knitted sideways in rows and as one piece. It has a total length of 50 (52 - 54 - 56 - 58 - 60) cm and a positive ease of 8 cm at 80 cm bust circumference (8 cm at 88 cm bust circumference - 6 cm at 96 cm bust circumference - 8 cm at 104 cm bust circumference - 8 cm at 116 cm bust circumference - 8 cm at 128 cm bust circumference).

### MATERIALS

Lana Grossa **ECOPUNO**

72 % Cotton, 17 % Virgin wool Merino, 11 % Alpaca

Meterage: approx. 215 m / 50 g

- C1: 150 (150 - 150 - 200 - 200 - 250) g grège (col 18)
- C2: 100 (150 - 150 - 200 - 200 - 250) g white (col 26)
- C3: 100 (150 - 150 - 200 - 200 - 250) g pearl beige (col 66)
- knitting needles no. 3,5 and 4
- circular knitting needles no. 3,5 / 40 and 80 cm

### STITCH PATTERNS

**Stockinette st:** RS-row: k, WS-row: p

**1x1 rib st in rows:** RS-row: \*k1, p1\* rep cont

WS-row: work all sts as they appear

**1x1 rib st in rnds:** \*k1, p1\* rep cont

**Slip st pattern in rows:** see chart. All RS and WS rows are pictured. Start each row with the sts in front of 1st arrow, work 4 sts patt rep cont and end with sts after 2nd arrow. Rep rows 1-8 cont.

**Stripe sequence:** rep cont

Rows 1-4: C3

Rows 5-8: C2

Rows 1-4: C1

Rows 5-8: C3

Rows 1-4: C2

Rows 5-8: C1

**Basic sl st selvedge:** sl the 1st st on each row p-wise wyif, k the last st on each row. Work all edge sts as basic sl st unless otherwise stated.

### GAUGE

26 sts and 40 rows in slip st pattern with needles no. 4 = 10 x 10 cm

Attention: Sl sts might hide other sts underneath. When counting sts pay attention to count all sts. 1 patt rep = 4 sts.

### PULLOVER

Cast on 56 (56 - 56 - 64 - 64 - 64) sts with needles no. 3,5 and C1. Work 17 rows in 1x1 rib st starting on a WS-row.

Change to needles no. 4, work 2 rnds in stockinette st whilst increasing 1 st on the 1st row. Cont in sl st pattern according to stripe sequence.

To shape the sleeves increase 1 sts on both sides: work increases 10x (10x - 10x - 8x - 8x - 8x) on every 8th row, 16x (12x - 10x - 8x - 8x - 8x) on every 4th row and 7x (15x - 17x - 25x - 25x - 25x) on every other row = 123 (131 - 131 - 147 - 147 - 147) sts.

After the last increase cast on 55 (57 - 63 - 59 - 65 - 71) sts on both sides = 233 (245 - 257 - 265 - 277 - 289) sts and incorporate sts into the slip st pattern. After 12 (12 - 14,5 - 18 - 19 - 21) cm and on a WS-row, bind off the middle st and finish row accordingly.

Now put front sts on hold and work the remaining 116 (122 - 128 - 132 - 138 - 144) back sts for another 20 (23 - 23 - 24 - 26 - 26) cm = 80 (92 - 92 - 96 - 104 - 104) rows. End on a RS-row and put all sts on hold.

Put front sts back to work. To shape the neckline bind off 6 sts on the 1st row and then 2x 2 sts and 5x 1 st on every other row. Work for another 12 (15 - 15 - 16 - 18 - 18) cm = 48 (60 - 60 - 64 - 72 - 72) rows. Then cast on 5x1 st, 2x 2 sts and 1x 6 sts on every other row and on edge of the neckline. On the following row work across all sts again and increase 1 st between back and front panel. Before joining both panels check if both panels are knitted up until the same patt row.

Work 12 (12 - 15,5 - 18 - 19 - 21) cm across all 233 (245 - 257 - 265 - 277 - 289) sts. Then bind off 55 (57 - 63 - 59 - 65 - 71) sts on both sides and start shaping the sleeves by decreasing 1 sts on both sides: Work decreases 7x (15x - 17x - 25x - 25x - 25x) on every other row, 16x (12x - 10x - 8x - 8x - 8x) on every 4th row and 10x (10x - 10x - 8x - 8x - 8x) on every 8th row. If necessary, finish the current color block.

Work 2 rnds in stockinette st and C1 and decrease 1 st on the 2nd row = 56 (56 - 56 - 64 - 64 - 64) sts. Change to needles no. 3,5 and C1. Work 17 rows in 1x1 rib st and then bind off all sts.

**Finishing:** Moisten, block and let air dry. Close side and sleeve seams. With circular needles no. 3,5 and C1 pick up sts from the hem = 118 (128 - 138 - 148 - 158 - 168) each from back and front panel. Join to work in the rnd and work 5 cm across all 236 (256 - 276 - 296 - 316 - 336) sts in 1x1 rib st. Bind off all sts. With circular needles no. 3,5 and C1 pick up 134 (144 - 144 - 146 - 150 - 150) sts from the neckline. Join to work in the rnd and work 3,5 cm in 1x1 rib st. Bind off all sts.



### GAUGE SWATCH

Create a gauge swatch! To do so knit a 12 x 12 cm piece in the given stitch pattern of your chosen design. Then count stitches and rows within a 10 x 10 cm area. In case there are fewer stitches or rows than stated in the instructions: Knit more tightly or use smaller needles (half to a whole needle size smaller). If you count more stitches or rows: Try knitting more loosely or use larger needles.

Note: Knitting results will vary. The gauge information on the yarn's band is based on plain stockinette stitch and should not be considered definitive. For a perfect piece making a gauge swatch in the given stitch pattern is essential so your desired design will not only look beautiful but also fit well!
